NEW IN 2025:

1. New Registration System

We are thrilled to let you know that we are using a new registration system this year. It is far easier to use and requires far less information. Because it is a new system your old ID and password will no longer be valid and a new ID must be set up. See: How to Register in the Toronto Kiwanis Festival 2025

2. Multiple Entries in a Class

Participants may now enter a class more than once, provided they select different repertoire for each entry. Separate registrations are required for each submission.

3. Classical Voice Classes are now by Age Levels

Classical Voice classes will now be organized by age rather than RCM grade levels. This adjustment accommodates:

- o The maturity of each performer's voice
- o Broader repertoire choices beyond syllabus limitations
- o The option to perform pieces from different RCM/CC grade levels
- Greater opportunity for ages 11+ to participate in the Live Provincial Finals
- Standardized age categories across all Voice classes, including Musical Theatre,
 Popular Voice, and Songs from the Screen and More:
 - Beginner (Ages 6–8)
 - Primary (Ages 9–10)
 - Elementary (Ages 11–12)
 - Junior (Ages 13–14)
 - Intermediate (Ages 15–16)
 - Senior (Ages 17–18)
 - Advanced (Ages 19–28)
 - Adults (Ages 29+)

4. Updated Terms for Class Levels

- We are no longer offering diploma/advanced classes in graded instrumental music.
 Anybody playing at the ARCT level or above must enter Open classes.
- Open: Now reserved for grade-level classes, combining both Open and Diploma levels.
- Advanced: Applied to age-based classes only.
